

# LYON, HOUSER & BARBIERE SCORE MULTIPLE RANKINGS

Lawrenceville, New Jersey — Thirty one prep schools are represented on the National Interscholastic Swimming Coaches Association 1966 Prep School All American Swimming Team, according to Philip G. Pratt, Lawrenceville School, who compiled the rankings.

"Two new records were set this year which is an outstanding achievement in view of the great number of records set the previous year," remarked Pratt. He said, "Next year will see further improvement as many of the best times were achieved by juniors. For the first time in many years, the two boys with the top number of nominations came from Southern California."

The two new NISCA prep records were made by the Lawrenceville 400 yd. freestyle relay team (William Crooks, Robert Nagle, Richard Tuggle, Eldon Loblein). The new record is 3:20.8, wiping out the old mark of 3:21.8 set last year by Williston.

Roger Lyon, a junior at Harvard School, clipped 3-tenths of a second off the Prep National mark of 1:46.3 set last year by Tom Johnson. Lyon clocked 1:46.0 in the district finals. In addition to setting the new 200 yd. prep mark, Lyon had the fastest prep clocking (52.3) in the 100 yd. butterfly, and also was an All American nominee in four other events for a total of six mentions.

Philip Houser, Chadwick School, was the number one ranked prepster in the 200 yd. individual medley (2:01.8) and the 400 yd. freestyle (3:56.0), and ranked in three other events, the butterfly, backstroke, and breaststroke to round out a versatile prep career.

Not far behind the California youths were Larry Barbriere, Hill School who ranked first in the 100 yd. backstroke (56.1), just a tenth faster than Andover's Jon Noll. He gained mention in three other events, and was second to Houser in the individual medley.

John Chapman, Marist School, had the fastest time (22.4) for the 50 yd. freestyle to gain number one ranking.

Curt Chambers, St. Andrews School, and Greg Olson, Gilmore Academy, both clocked 49.2 to earn first in the 100 yd. freestyle All America. Chambers was ranked 2nd in the 200 yd. freestyle, and Olson was tied for second in the 50 yd. freestyle by William Crooks, Lawrenceville.

Pete Harding, University, was the number one prep breaststroke All America, clocking 1:02.0.

University School of Cleveland had the fastest 200 yd. med-

## INDIANA & MICHIGAN GAIN MOST PLACES IN '66 NCAA ALL AMERICA

Minneapolis, Minn. — The NCAA All America Selection Committee (Art Adamson, Texas A & M; William Brooks, Harvard; Robert Clotworthy, Princeton; Peter Daland, Southern California; Patrick Earey, North Carolina; Edward Gabel, Western Michigan; John Higgins, Navy; Jay Markley, Oklahoma; Art Solow, Colorado State; and myself) present the 1966 All America selections as one of the best of collegiate swimmers in history.

The problems of the committee were compounded this year by the fact that the NCAA Championships were held at Air Force Academy where the high altitude caused variances in performances that complicated the selections. Additionally, a number of the Eastern teams were conspicuous by their absence and this was a decided hindrance in trying to evaluate these men with the athletes who were at the Nationals. However, we are firm in our conviction that the men selected are completely deserving of the All-America recognition.

The winner of each event at the NCAA Championships is automatically selected for the top spot on the All-America. The second place winner is given the second spot on the team. After that, it is primarily on the basis of verified times through the season with performance at the NCAA's taking precedence over all else (providing the athletes were there), and next the performance in the Conference or Regional Championships, and lastly performance in dual meets. No distinction is made in the certificates awarded except that the NCAA winner will have this noted on his certificate.

Thirty-four schools are represented on the 1966 All-America, which is one more than last year. Indiana leads the way with twenty-five spots on the team and three relays. Eight of these spots are in diving. Michigan is next with twenty individual places and three relays, with 4 individual places coming in diving. Southern California is third with seventeen places, all swimming, and three relays.

Carl Robie again led the way by being picked in five individual events and was also a member of two relays that were selected.

These men will receive their certificates with indication of having won the NCAA event: James Van Kennen, Jr., Westleyan, 50 free; Don Roth, Calif. at Santa Barbara, 100 free; Roy Saari, USC, 200\*, 500\* and 1650\* free; Phil Riker, North Carolina, 100 fly; Carl Robie, Michigan, 200 fly; Gary J. Dilley, Michigan State, 100\* and 200\* backstroke; Paul Scheerer, Michigan, 100 breast; Wayne Anderson, USC, 200 breast; William Utley, Ind., 200 individual medley; Ken Webb, Ind., 400 individual medley; Ken Sitzberger, Ind., 1-meter dive\*; Bernard Wrightson, Ariz. St., 3-meter dive. \*Retained first place ranking.


For the third year in a row, Saari led in three individual events. For the second year in a row, Dilley led in both backstroke events.






## DANIELSON SETS TWO OF EIGHT NATIONAL JC MARKS


### FOOTHILL WINS JC CROWN FOR 5th STRAIGHT

Los Altos, Calif. — Nort Thornton added his fifth straight California Junior College Championship to his string of records at the Annual State JC meet, May 5, 6, 7. Thornton's Owls took the lead on the first day by winning the 400 yd. medley relay, and were never headed. The final score was 368½ to runnerup Los Angeles Valley College 266½. Trailing the leaders were: College of San Mateo 175, Long Beach City College 138½, Pasadena City College 94½, Fullerton 91, Citrus 86½, Cerritos 74½, Sequoias 58 and San Jose City College 55½. Twenty one other JC's scored and two schools were unable to get a point.

Steve Danielson, Los Angeles Valley College, was most impressive as he shocked the 35 college coaches and a capacity crowd at the Foothill College pool, who watched one of the greatest college championships. Danielson, a sophomore, with George Watson, Foothill, at his shoulder, heeded his coach's advice and went out fast in the 500 yd. freestyle, and came home in a solid 4:44.7 to set a new National JC record. Watson also went under the old record of 4:45.5 set by Greg Buckingham in 1965, by clocking 4:45.4. Finishing behind the leaders were: George Horton, LAV, 4:55.7, Ron Coffman, FOOT, 5:02.0 and Dave Gray, SM, 5:04.7.

Coach Mike Wiley's outstanding distance swimmer came back in the 1650 yd. freestyle to win his second gold medal and set another National JC record. The Valley freestyler again set a fast pace and dropped his northern rival early in the race. Danielson clocked 16:52.6 ripping almost two seconds off the old mark of 16:54.4 set by Greg Buckingham in 1965. Watson returned a time of 17:04.8 followed by George Horton 17:30.5, Terry Finucane, LAV, 17:45.9, and Ron Coffman, 17:54.8. The times by Horton and Finucane were the swimmers best, with the latter dropping almost two full minutes from his previous best.

Don Gray, San Mateo, in the 50 free tied the NJC mark of 21.8 set by Bob Boyer in 1964. Trailing Gray was Ken Hammer, Cerritos, 22.0, a JD, Hank Thayer, Orange Coast College, 22.0, Jim Davis, San Joaquin Delta, 22.2 and Bruce Bricker, Sequoia, 22.2.

A quartet of John Leasure (55.1), Tom Falzone (1:00.5), Rick Skarbo (53.0) and Jon Shores (48.2) set a national JC record in the 400 yd. medley with a brilliant 3:37.2. The old mark of 3:40.4 was set last year by Orange Coast. LA Valley finished second in 3:44.3, followed by Long Beach 3:44.7.


John Leasure, Foothill, set two JC national marks in the backstroke. In the 100 yd. event, John clocked 54.7 to wipe out Terry Craig's mark set in '65. However, in the final, Leasure could go no faster than 55.6, which wasn't good enough as his teammate, Rick Skarbo won the championship in 55.2. Third place went to Modesto's Gordon Johnson, 55.8.

In the 200 yd. event, Leasure ripped more than 2-seconds


RECORD SETTER—Foothill Coach, Nort Thornton talks with double backstroke record holder, John Leasure.

off the mark of 2:03.2 set by Ken Webb in 1965. The gold medal winner clocked 2:00.9, followed by Johnson, 2:04.4, and Skarbo, 2:05.5.

Dennis Putnam, a freshman at Long Beach City College, won the 100 yd. freestyle in 47.5, after breaking Gary Ilman's national JC mark of 47.4 in the trials with a 47.3 clocking. Trailing the Long Beach sprinter were Ken Hammer, Cerr, 47.8, Kim Roush, LAV, 48.0 and Don Gray, 48.2.

The last JC national mark came in the final event of the meet, as LA Valley's 800 yd. freestyle relay team of Darryl Cooper, Steve Danielson, Tom Nielsen and George Horton, clocked 7:24.5 to Foothill's 7:26.6 and Long Beach City College's 7:27.6.

Bill Johnson, Fullerton, was a double winner. The Fullerton swimmer won the 200 yd. individual medley in 2:01.0 followed by Tony Gleason, Santa Ana, 2:02.4. Johnson's second gold medal came in the 100 yd. butterfly, setting a pool record to win in 52.3. Trailing were Dean Bisterfeldt, West Valley, 52.8, John Reitman, Santa Monica CC, 53.0 and Pat Yelovich, Harbor, 53.2.

Yelovich had previously won the 200 yd. butterfly in 1:58.6, followed by Danielson 1:59.2 and Hammer 2:00.2.

Bill Powers, Citrus, won the 100 yd. breaststroke, setting a meet record of 1:01.4. Bruce Evans, Foothill and his teammate Tom Falzone tied for second, 1:01.9.

In the 200 yd. breaststroke, Falzone again tied, this time for first on a JD, as Bill Powers clocked 2:17.2 and the Foothill swimmer returned 2:17.3. Bruce Evans was third, 2:18.2 followed by his teammate Jim Robertson, 2:20.2.

Tony Gleason, Santa Ana, won the 400 yd. individual medley, 4:32.7 followed by Ralph Nelson, LAV, 4:36.9 and Dennis Bello, SM, 4:38.0.

George Watson won the 200 yd. freestyle in 1:45.5, a meet record, as Dennis Putnam, 1:46.1 and Bill Johnson, 1:46.4 followed in that order.

The 400 yd. freestyle relay was won by Foothill, 3:15.2, followed by LA Valley 3:16.5 and Cerritos 3:17.7. Watson anchored his winning team with a 46.9 leg.

Rusty McCarthy, Valley, and Pat Lane, Citrus, exchanged places in the three and one meter dive. Rusty scored 517.05 for the 3-meter crown to Lane's 472.25. In the 1-meter, Lane totaled 429.90 to McCarthy's 390.40. Bakersfield's Burton Senior was third in both events.

# SPITZ & SANTA CLARA HIGH - NATION'S BEST

Detroit, Michigan — Mark Spitz, a sophomore at Santa Clara High School and his Santa Clara teammates, coached by George Haines, compiled the most outstanding high school All America record ever achieved.

Spitz led the 1966 National Interscholastic Swimming Coaches Association High School All America listing in two individual events, the 200 yd. individual medley (1:59.0) and the 100 yd. butterfly (51.9), both National High School records. In addition, he ranked 9th in the 200 yd. freestyle (1:47.8), tied for 7th in the 100 yd. freestyle (48.5), tied for 5th in the 100 yd. backstroke (54.9) and 4th in the 400 yd. freestyle (3:49.5).

Santa Clara set national high school marks in winning first place All American rankings in both relays. A quartet of Bob Jamison, Bruce Fisher, Spitz and Kim Cummings set a record of 3:14.5 for the 400 yd. freestyle relay, and a foursome of Mitch Ivey, Jack Faunce, Spitz and Jamison set a 200 yd. medley mark of 1:37.2.

Jamison equaled the 100 yd. freestyle National High School record of 47.7 set by Steve Clark back in 1961, as he was ranked first in the All America listing for this event.

Faunce cracked the National High School mark for the 100 yd. breaststroke, clocking 1:00.7, to head the All America breaststroke listing.

Charles Goettsche, New Trier, Illinois, lowered the National High School backstroke record to 54.1 as he paced the nation in the All America rankings for this event. Ed Bettendorf, Fairview, Ohio, ranked second in this event, 54.3 as Santa Clarans, Bob Burke and Mitch Ivey followed, each clocking 54.8.

John Dowdle, Loyola Academy, Illinois, was the fastest high school swimmer in the 200 yd. freestyle event, clocking 1:45.2, just 3-tenths of a second ahead of Arcadia, California's Greg Charlton who zipped the course in 1:45.5 for second place in the NISCA All America rankings. Pompano Beach, Florida's John Nelson was third with a 1:45.8.

Greg Charlton ranked first in the 400 yd. freestyle All America rank, his 3:45.7 being a second faster than Nelson's 3:46.7, with Douglas Webster, Kimball, Royal Oak, Mich., next at 3:49.4.

Louis Janos, Miami Springs, Florida, streaked 50 yds. in 21.4 for first place ranking in this event, setting a new National High School record.

It was a great year for high school swimming as national marks were set in all events except the 200 yd. and 400 yd. freestyle (sc). In addition, on the 20 yd. course, Phil Harburg, NCAA Swimming Records Chairman, reported that both Jackman, Midpark H.S., Cleveland, and Stephen Job, Warren Harding H.S., Warren, Ohio, set new National High School marks for the 60 yd. freestyle at 26.8. Frank Hartye Trinity H.S., Louisville, Ky., set a National High School mark of 3:53.1 for the 400 yd. freestyle (20 yd.).

California led the entire nation in individual swimming events. The Golden Bear state placed men in 51 rankings out of a possible 167 listed. For a clearer breakdown, Northern California won 34 individual rankings, while the swimmers in Southern California were listed 17 times in individual rankings. In addition, Northern California had 9 schools in the relay All America listings, and Southern California, 7 for a state total 16, out of 40 possibilities.

Illinois, despite a predominance of performances by California, improved their position in the national picture. In 1965, Illinois posted 27 individual and 8 relays in All America, brightened their outlook as they posted 31 individual listings and 14 relays. Only the amazing effort by the Santa Clara team lessened the brightness of the great showing by high school swimmers from Illinois.

Fifteen other states placed men in the All America rankings. Pennsylvania with 11 individual swimming postings and two relays placed third in overall standings, followed by Florida with 11 individuals and 1 relay, Ohio, 10 individuals and 3 relays, Michigan, 10 individuals and 1 relay, Indiana and Texas each with five individuals and 1 relay, New Jersey, 4-2, Washington, 5 individuals, Minnesota and Kentucky with 3 individuals, Georgia, North Carolina and New York with two individuals each, and Iowa with 1 individual and 2 relays.

Evanston's Fred Southward placed in 5 individual events. Fred was ranked 4th in the 200 yd. freestyle (1:46.0), 6th in the 400 yd. freestyle (3:50.6), tied for 12th in the 100 yd. backstroke (56.5), 17th in the 100 yd. butterfly (54.5), and 16th in the 200 yd. individual medley (2:04.8).

Eric Schwall, Enloe High, N.C., tied for second in the 100 yd. freestyle (48.0) and tied for 11th in the 50 yd. freestyle (22.2).

Bruce Richards, Wilson High, Washington, ranked 5th in the 200 yd. medley (2:01.5) and 4th in the 100 yd. breaststroke (1:02.8).

Other noteworthy achievements were by Ed Bettendorf, 4th in the 200 yd. medley (2:01.4); John Ferris, Rio Americano, Calif., 7th in the 200 yd. medley (2:02.3) and tied for 7th in the 200 yd. butterfly (53.5), 12th in both the 400 yd. freestyle (3:56.3) and the 200 yd. freestyle (1:48.3) and 19th in the 100 yd. freestyle (49.2). Ferris is only a junior.

John Nelson, in addition to his times in the 200 yd. and 400 yd. freestyle also made All America in the 200 yd. medley (2:01.8) and the 100 yd. butterfly (53.3).

Bob Chatfield, Cubberly High, Calif., ranked second in both the 200 yd. medley (2:00.0) and the 100 yd. butterfly (52.5).

If the name of James Counsilman, University, Indiana, sounds familiar, you guessed it. Jimmy is the son of Doc Counsilman, Indiana's coach, and as a sophomore he's moving as he earned All America ranking tying for 11th in the 100 yd. breaststroke (1:03.5).



# LEASURE & DANIELSON BREAK RECORDS

Foothill College again dominated the Junior College 1966 All-American team as compiled by John Stonebraker, Mt. San Antonio College, with 29 selections, with Los Angeles Valley College second with 22 All-American picks.

Four swimmers placed first on the All-American list in two events each. John Leasure of Foothill and Steve Danielson of LA Valley both broke Junior College records in placing first in their two events. Leasure set new backstroke records with a 54.7 100 yd. back and a 2:00.9 200 back. Danielson broke the distance freestyle marks with a 4:44.7 500 yd. and a 16:52.6 1650 free.

Bill Johnson of Fullerton placed in the number one spot in two different races. Johnson ranked first in the 100 yd. butterfly with 52.3 and also rated tops in the 200 yd. individual medley with 2:01.0. Bill Powers of Citrus topped the list in both breaststroke events, clocking 1:01.4 in the 100 yd. breast and 2:17.2 in the 200 yd. breast.

Junior College records were set by the number one men in the freestyle sprints. Don Gray of San Mateo headed the 50 yd. free list with 21.8 ahead of Ken Hammer, Cerritos, 21.9, Dennis Putman, Long Beach, 21.9, and Powers, Citrus, and Hank Thayer, Orange Coast, both 22.0. Putman set the mark in the 100 yd. free with 47.3 leading Hammer, Cerritos, 47.8, Kim Roush, LA Valley, 48.0, and Gray, San Mateo, 48.2.



## KINKEAD, WARE TRIPLE WINNERS; WESTFIELD COPS 2nd YMCA TITLE

Kalamazoo, Michigan — Huntington (Indiana) YMCA natators Gary Kinkead and Steve Ware swept to three gold medals apiece at the 39th National YMCA Swimming and Diving Championships.

Kinkead copped firsts in the 500 yd. freestyle (sc), 5:05.3, after placing second at last year's meet, followed by teammate Steve Folk, 5:11.4, and Dave Demarest, Westfield, New Jersey, 5:16.6; 1650 yd. freestyle, 18:17.1, with Folk again second, 18:30.9, and Kalamazoo's Steve Roxborough third, 18:34.0, and 200 yd. backstroke, 2:05.0, disposing of Westfield's John Ketcham, 2:09.4, and Bob Lodato, Evansville, Indiana, 2:09.5.

Ware erased National YMCA marks in the 200 yd. individual medley, 2:04.2, defeating David Frisch, Bronx Union Y, 2:08.4, and Van Rockefeller, Huntington, 2:09.0, and 200 yd. breaststroke, 2:15.6, downing Ron Berry, Cedar Rapids, Iowa, 2:22.6, and David Frisch, 2:25.6. Steve also secured a win in the 100 yd. breaststroke, 1:03.1, finishing ahead of Ron Berry, 1:04.2, and David Frisch, 1:04.7.

Team competition saw Westfield of New Jersey win its second straight title with 304½ points, defeating Huntington, Indiana, 273½, who prior to last year's meet had annexed four team crowns in a row. Completing the team finishers, which brought together a total of 32 clubs, were Evansville, Indiana, 121¾; Bronx Union, New York, 120, and Mid-County, Brentwood, Missouri, 117.

Ross Wales, Youngstown, Ohio, eclipsed two National YMCA records. Ross successfully defended his 200 yd. butterfly title with a 1:59.3 effort, defeating Van Rockefeller, Huntington, 2:00.0, and John Munk, Flushing, 2:05.1, and also conquered the field in the 100 yd. butterfly, 51.4, with Rockefeller second, 53.8, and Jamie Halpin, Cedar Rapids, Iowa, third in 54.3.

Jud Alward, Tri-Cities, Michigan, doubled in diving action. Jud took the one meter with 361.05 points, followed by Westfield divers Don Mutz, 330.05, and Jeffrey Schaub, 328.35, and three meter, 407.85, edging Bruce McLay, Tri-Cities, 403.90, and Bill Scott, Monroe, Michigan, 381.60.

Westfield captured firsts in all three relay events. The crew of John Ketcham, John Greene, Harvey Gerber, and Doug McOwen won the 400 yd. medley, 3:47.2, edging Huntington, 3:47.4, and Cedar Rapids, Iowa, 3:51.9. The foursome of Tom McCoy, Harvey Gerber, McOwen, and Cairns copped the 400 yd. freestyle with a 3:21.9, besting Ridgewood, New Jersey, 3:26.3, and Porter County, Indiana, 3:26.6, while the team of Dave Demarest, Bruce Hartlein, McCoy, and Cairns set a National YMCA standard in the 800 yd. freestyle, 7:45.5, downing Evansville, 7:47.6, and Mid-County, 7:52.7.

Westfield performers Doug McOwen and John Ketcham came through with victories. McOwen broke a National YMCA mark in the 50 yd. freestyle, 22.0, topping Greg McDonald, Porter County, Valparaiso, Indiana, 22.3, with Bill Barthold, Kalamazoo, and Jim Kohnowich, Ridgewood, 22.9 and 22.7, tying for third. Ketcham prevailed in the 100 yd. backstroke, 57.2, disposing of Bob Lodato, Evansville, 57.7, and Gregory Gush, Raritan Valley, New Jersey, 58.8.

Harvey Gerber also picked up a win for Westfield. Harvey took the 200 yd. freestyle, 1:51.3, downing Charles Alley, Ridgewood, 1:53.4, and Rodger Walk, Kettering, Ohio, 1:53.4.

Huntington's Steve Folk splashed to a National YMCA record in the 400 yd. individual medley. Folk was clocked in 4:30.1, defeating Evansville's Jim Smith, 4:37.4, and Bronx Union's James Veres, 4:44.9.

Greg McDonald, Porter County, impressed in the 100 yd. freestyle. Greg finished in 49.4, downing Mike Kalmbach, Toledo Central, Ohio, 49.6, and Westfield's Doug McOwen, 49.8.
