

28 PREPS REPRESENTED ON 1969 PREP ALL AMERICA

CHATFIELD AND BARBIERE RIP NATIONAL MARKS, HEAD 2 EVENTS

Pottstown, Pa. — Mark Chatfield, a tenth grader from Flintridge Prep, California set two national prep school records and Larry Barbieri, a senior from Calvert Hall, Maryland, set one national prep mark to head the 1969 Prep All America Selections of the National Interscholastic Swimming Coaches Association of America, as compiled by Alan A. Switzer, Jr., Chairman of the All America Committee.

Chatfield erased the old standard of 1:59.5 by Tom Warburton in 1968 in the 200 yd. individual medley with a clocking of 1:59.4, two-tenths of a second faster than Barbieri, who made the second fastest prep time of the year. The Californian also lowered, by one tenth of a second, the old 100 yd. breaststroke mark of 1:00.5 by Allen Richardson in 1965. The second fastest clocking of the year in this event was a 1:02.0 by Pine Crest's Murray Grenier. Chatfield also tied for the fourth fastest time in the backstroke, 56.0.

Barbieri, the prep swimmer of the year, in addition to being runnerup in the individual medley, was first in the 100 yd. backstroke, 53.7, a clocking that lowered Russ Kingery's mark of 55.3 set in 1964, first in the 100 yd. butterfly, 52.5, third in the 100 yd. freestyle, 47.5 and eighth in the 200 yd. freestyle, 1:48.6.

Twenty-eight prep schools placed 93 swimmers and 10 divers on the All American team, four schools less than in 1968.

Russell Varley, Episcopal Academy, Pennsylvania, lowered the national prep mark of 3:46.9 by Tom Warburton set in 1968 to a solid 3:45.7. Varley also placed fourth in the 200 yd. freestyle, 1:47.2 and ninth in the 100 yd. breaststroke, 1:04.5.

The Lawrenceville 200 yd. medley relay (Steve McCarthy, Fred Tullis, Bob Nagle, and Mark Rawleigh) clocked 1:39.6 for a prep record. The old mark was 1:40.1 by Pine Crest of Florida in 1968.

Chris Noll, Pine Crest, Ft. Lauderdale, Florida, is the fastest prep swimmer of the year in the 200 yd. freestyle event, 1:46.0, followed by Lawrenceville's Ted Kriebel, 1:46.6 and St. Andrews' Fred Tyler, 1:46.9. Noll was also the runnerup in the 400 free, 3:49.4, while Tyler had the third best time in the 400, 3:49.5.

Tim Dorr, Jesuit High, Florida, was the fastest prep sprinter in the nation in the 50 free, 21.6, as Doug Markwardt, Pine Crest, 21.7 was the only other prep schooler able to break 22 seconds.

Newark Academy's Chip Harrison was a tick faster than Bruce Josten, Mercersburg Academy, Penn., in the 100 yd. freestyle. Harrison was credited with a 48.1 clocking and Josten a 48.2.

In the 100 yd. butterfly, John Kagan, Pine Crest, clocked 52.9, and Lawrenceville's Bob Nagle, posted 53.4, to trail the leader of the event, Barbieri, 52.5.

Steve McCarthy, Lawrenceville, and Jay Hoffacker, Wardlaw Country Day School, N.J., were runnersup in the 100 yd. backstroke to Barbieri, returning 54.9 and 55.4 respectively.

Since divers are listed only by alphabetical order, no ranking is possible. Repeating from the 1968 All America were Mike deGruy, Sewanee Military Academy, Tenn., Billy Heinz, Westminster, Ga., Don Orlovsky, St. Andrews and Mark Tullis, Lawrenceville.

Pine Crest (Rex Boder, Tom Troost, Chris Noll and Doug Markwardt) again headed the All America 400 yd. freestyle relay selections, clocking 3:15.2 with Lawrenceville, 3:16.9 the runnerup.

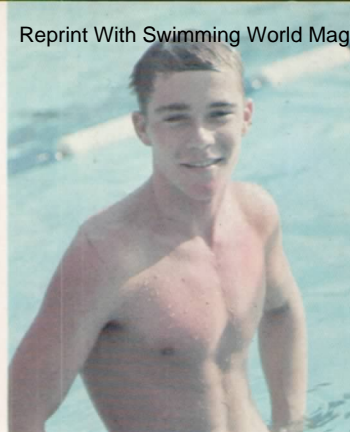

5 SWIMMERS NAMED IN 3 EVENTS INDIANA AND USC GAIN MOST PLACES IN '69 NCAA ALL AMERICA SELECTIONS

Salt Lake City, Utah—Indiana University led by Charles Hickcox and Mark Spitz, each with three nominations, and University of Southern California, with Greg Charlton also winning three places, led the field in the 1969 National Collegiate Athletic Association All-America selections, announced Don B. Reddish, Chairman of the NCAA Selection Committee.

For Hickcox, it was a repeat of last year when he alone earned three individual places. Indiana in 1968 held a total of 20 places in individual swimming events, plus three relays and ten diving. This year, the Hoosiers again equalled the total of 33, but increased their individual swimming places to 25 as their divers could gain but five places.

Last year, USC achieved 15 individual swimming places plus three relays. This year the Trojans made mentions with 30 individual swimming mentions, or double the previous year, plus three relays.

Runnersup to the two leaders were Stanford and Yale, each with 16 mentions, UCLA with 14, Michigan, 13, including five diving places, Ohio State, nine, and California State at Long Beach with eight.

Thirty-nine schools, two more than in 1968, were represented in the 1969 All-America.

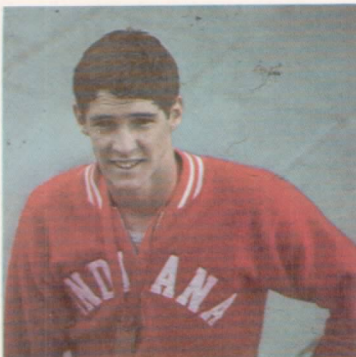
In addition to Hickcox, Spitz and Charlton, each who made the individual listings three times, SMU's Jerry Heidenreich and Michigan's Juan Bello also made triple events.

The winner of each event in the NCAA Championships is automatically selected for the top spot on the All-America team; the second place finisher is also awarded second on the team. Thereafter, it is primarily on the basis of verified times throughout the season with performance in the NCAA's taking precedence over all else (the swimmer must be present), and next the performance in the conference or regional championships, and lastly, performances in dual meets. No distinction is made in the certificates awarded except that the NCAA winner will have this noted on his certificate.

All-Americans who repeated their first place rankings numbered but two, Charles Hickcox who repeated in the 200 yd. backstroke and 200 yd. individual medley and his Hoosier

teammate, Jim Henry who gained the top rank in the 1-meter board.

Mark Spitz, another Hoosier, and only a freshman, headed the honor roll in the 200 yd. freestyle, 500 yd. freestyle and 100 yd. butterfly. Greg Charlton made the All-America listings in the 200 yd. freestyle, 500 yd. freestyle and 1650 yd. freestyle. Juan Bello achieved his triple in the 200 yd. freestyle, 100 yd. butterfly and 200 yd. individual medley. Jerry Heidenreich made his All America in the 100 yd. freestyle, 200 yd. freestyle, and 100 yd. butterfly.

State, LB, 400 yd. individual medley; Jim Henry, Ind. three-meter diving.
