

Donovan leads Wood

With five events remaining, and Archbishop Wood clinging to a four-point lead against visiting St. Hubert in a Philadelphia Catholic League girls' swimming meet last Wednesday, it was time for the Vikings' Megan Donovan to step to center stage.

Three Donovan victories later, the Vikings had their victory, by a 95-75 final tally.

It came as no surprise to Wood coach Charlie Stillwell.

"Megen is probably the best swimmer in the league," Stillwell said.

Donovan, a junior, came through with individual wins in the 500 freestyle and 100 breaststroke as well as an anchor leg victory in the 400 freestyle relay.

Then add the 200 individual medley and the 200 freestyle to the events in which the multitalented Donovan competes.

Last year, Donovan took home the gold medal in the PCL's 500 freestyle championship and has already dropped 10 seconds off her time in that event this season.

"Megen wants to go for the 500 freestyle record this year," Stillwell said. "She works extremely hard. She's a very motivated kid."

Donovan's times in the 500 freestyle and the breaststroke are the best in the PCL, while she ranks a very close second in the IM.

Stillwell believes that the junior phenom could possibly dip below the two minute mark in the 200 freestyle in the very near future, maybe even in the upcoming week.

Donovan's is a story of how great things can happen when talent meshes with motivation.

As a freshman, she barely missed earning All-PCL status in two events.

Not one to be deterred by any losses, Donovan came back stronger as a sophomore and in addition to her 500 freestyle victory, also placed second in the PCL breaststroke championship.

Along with Alyse Davis, Amy Finn and Christina Rios, Donovan makes up Wood's very tough 400 freestyle relay squad.

Donovan's favorite event is the 500 freestyle, a grueling event that tests the swimmer's stamina. To help with that, she has been training with a distance team over the past two years.

The 200 IM — which is truly for the all-around swimmer, as it combines backstroke, butterfly, breaststroke and freestyle — has captured the competitor in Donovan.

"I'm working hard on my butterfly," the junior said. "The breaststroke pulls me through. I'm shakiest in the backstroke. I

need to work hard on technique."

Her coach is thrilled to have someone with Donovan's enthusiasm and work ethic for the sport.

"Megen wants to learn how to do things better," Stillwell said. "She's a nice kid, too."

To look at Donovan, one would not know that she is such a fierce competitor.

"She's skinny as a rail," Stillwell said. "She just kicks everybody's butt."

Wood had a tremendous meet against the Bambis last Wednesday night as Jaclyn Smith finished first in both the 100 and 200 freestyle races, while Davis took top-spot in the 200 IM and Rios captured the 50 freestyle as well as the 100 backstroke events.

The Vikings' 200 -relay quartet of Smith, Davis, Rios and Megan Gannon also took home the gold in their 20-point team-victory.

It was truly a red letter night for Archbishop Wood girls swimming.

The New Year brings the hope of better things to come, but **Archbishop Wood** has some solid evidence on which to base those expectations.

Saturday at Stroudsburg High School's Winter Swim Classic, Wood was third with 244 points behind East Stroudsburg South (255) and team champion Father Judge (270).

"The guys felt really good with the way they did and this should give them a confidence boost," Vikings coach Charlie Stillwell said.

The 400-yard freestyle relay — Brendon McGhee, David Keller, John Wright and Sean Joyce — finished first in 3 minutes, 45.24 seconds.

Veteran **Archbishop Wood** coach Charlie Stillwell has seen swimmers like junior Tim Miller before, athletes who get a late start to scholastic competition yet immediately show their potential in different events.

"Tim started as basically a summer swimmer as a freshman," Stillwell said.

"Last season as a sophomore he came out for the team towards the end of the year and had his time in the 100-yard breaststroke down around 1 minute, 10 seconds."

A virus left Miller competing at less than top shape for the team's first Philadelphia Catholic League meet of this season, but he has bounced back and is looking much stronger.

"This year we don't have any freshmen on the squad," the coach said. "Everyone must contribute so it's good to see Tim getting better each day. I watched Tim's stroke today and you can see how he's getting a lot stronger and more consistent with his time."

"I'm really going to be pushing these kids hard in practice for about the next two weeks so they'll all be ready to peak by the end of the season and the PCL championships. I think Tim should be down around 1:07 or 1:08 if not better by then."

Press poses no problem for Wood's

Some athletes may have a contentious relationship with the press, but that is not the case with Megan Donovan of Archbishop Wood. That is because, when she is not setting records in the pool

for the Vikings, she is the press.

Donovan is the sports editor of the school paper. She has not written any stories about all her accomplishments, however.

"I'm really pretty humble," she said. "I'm not really into focusing attention on myself. I wouldn't write about myself."

That is not to say Donovan, a junior, hasn't created a lot of news the paper could report.

In the Stroudsburg Invitation-

al last month, Donovan broke meet records in the 500 freestyle and the 100 breaststroke.

She has the fastest time in the 500 freestyle in the Philadelphia Catholic League this season by a margin of almost eight seconds faster than her nearest competitor, has the best time in the league in the breaststroke and is only .06 of a second behind Christine Swiker of Archbishop Ryan for fastest 200 IM.

"The coach said college coaches look at the junior year the most when recruiting so I'm glad I'm doing well," said Donovan. "I had a 5:25 last year when I won the PCL (in the 500 freestyle) and I'm already at 5:13. I'm pretty excited to see how the rest of the season goes."

Donovan was a good swimmer for the Maplewood Swim Club and Our Lady of Good Counsel's CYO team (where she was named the school's scholar-athlete), but

she admits she really did not dedicate herself until the last few years.

As a freshman at Wood, she joined the Energy club team in Langhorne coached by Bill Trabosh. The intensity level was something she was not used to.

"At Energy they work you real hard, and when I was a freshman, I wasn't prepared," said Donovan.

"But now I'm much more focused on swimming. It used to be just a fun thing when I was younger."

"Bill Trabosh has really worked me hard the last couple of years and I think that's why I've gotten better."

Energy conducts practices in the morning and afternoons six days a week and Donovan regularly attends them even when Wood has practice.

"(Wood coach Charlie Stilwell) is perfectly OK with me going to their practices; he knows they'll work me hard there," said Donovan. "When I go to the Wood

practice, it is more like a social thing where I can be with my friends, although I have made some good friendships at Energy, too."

Megen Donovan broke two meet records at East

Stroudsburg, in the 500 freestyle (5:16.50) and 100 breaststroke (1:09.32). Donovan also won the 200 individual medley and teamed with Christina Rios, Jaclyn Smith and Amy Finn to finish second in the 400 freestyle relay.

Smith, in addition, won the 200 freestyle.

Last season, Wood finished third in the PCL behind Archbishop Ryan and Cardinal O'Hara. The way things are looking, they might move up a spot.

Wood fell to Ryan, 100-68, in a dual meet last week, but Smith won the 200 freestyle once again and Donovan triumphed in the 200 IM and 500 freestyle. Smith, Rios, Finn and Donovan also won the 400 freestyle relay by more than 11 seconds.

AW's depth key factor to success

An influx of freshman talent combined with a strong returning sophomore class have given Archbishop Wood a much deeper roster than it had last season.

"The difference this year is the team's a lot deeper," Vikings coach Charlie Stillwell said.

"We have a lot of good freshmen, and the freshmen from last year are really stepping it up. We've got a lot of strong girls."

The Vikings are only 1-1 in dual meets this season, with a win against Gwynedd Mercy and a loss to the team directly ahead of them in the standings, Archbishop Ryan. But the youngsters on the team gave the Vikings a boost in the Winter Swim Classic at Stroudsburg High School on Jan. 7, where Wood finished first in the team competition over eight other schools. Last year, the Vikings finished third in the same tournament.

Sophomores Christina Rios and Amy Finn and freshman Alyse Davis all had strong efforts at Stroudsburg, and junior Jaclyn Smith won the 200 freestyle. Megen Donovan had the best individual showing for the Vikings, not only winning the 500 freestyle and 100 breaststroke, but setting meet records in the process.

"I was surprised that they swam that well [at Stroudsburg]," Stillwell said. "The reason we won is that we were pretty deep. We can give everybody a run for their money. I can't complain with anything they've given me this year."

Wood rallies past Father Judge

Right at the heart of Archbishop Wood's exciting Philadelphia Catholic League come-from-behind 88-82 boys' swimming victory over visiting Father Judge last Wednesday night were the performances of two seniors who have proven that hard work, patience and four years of steady improvement can lead to great individual and team success when nurtured properly.

Tom Whelan and Jim Hurley have both moved into the heart of their final seasons as Vikings' swimmers with great confidence regarding what they have already accomplished, as well as the potentially great things that the next two months may bring.

With the Vikings trailing Judge 72-68 and only two events remaining, Hurley captured first place in the 100 breaststroke in 1:06.87, with Whelan running second — just a shade over one second behind. The 10 points garnered by these two sent the Vikes into the lead, which they maintained with a victory in the meet's final event, the 400 freestyle relay.

Of course, Hurley and anchor man Whelan played a major role in the meet's decisive race, as they — along with Brendon McGhee and Sean Joyce — swam to victory in 3:37.43, 1.54 seconds better than Judge's four-seconds of Nick Montenaro, Brian

Quigley, Shawn Mitkus and Matt Harner.

Whelan is strongest individually in the breaststroke and sprint freestyle events, finishing runnerup in last year's PCL 100 breaststroke championship.

Named to the All-Catholic team as both a sophomore and junior, Whelan — according to coach Charlie Stillwell — has tremendous ability.

"Far and away, Tom has the most talent on our team," Stillwell said.

Whelan has followed in the footsteps of his older brother, Kevin, who was a senior during Tom's freshman year.

Kevin Whelan holds the Wood breaststroke record that Tom is pushing hard to break.

"Tom works very hard in practice," Stillwell said. "That would be something if Tom broke his brother's record."

Whelan — whose favorite event is the breaststroke — keeps it simple, using Stillwell as his lone instructor.

Earlier in the meet with Judge, Whelan, also a Wood lacrosse standout, captured the 50 freestyle, in 24.34.

Amazingly, Whelan had a bout with mononucleosis around Christmastime and has only recently overcome the after-effects of the disease.

"I'm just getting over it," the senior said.

To improve in the pool, Whelan started weight training

last year.

"I've been working hard," said Whelan.

Jim Hurley is a highly versatile swimmer, participating along the way in the breaststroke, individual medley, butterfly and sprint relays.

Four years ago, it was unlikely that Hurley would become such a major force for the Vikings.

"When Jim was a freshman, he had never swum on a year-round basis," Stillwell said. "He didn't really know how to swim (as a championship-style swimmer)."

So much has changed for Hurley, who has improved tremendously every year.

In fact, this winter alone, Hurley's butterfly time has dropped three seconds since the start of the season.

"Jim is so strong in the water," Stillwell said. "He just goes really fast."

As a junior, Hurley wasn't expected to do much.

"Last year, he came out of nowhere," Stillwell said.

In fact, as a junior, Hurley dropped almost five full seconds off his breaststroke time and almost made All-Catholic at the PCL championships.

Hurley really enjoys what he is doing.

"The season's going by too fast," he said. "I've improved my stroke, my turns and my technique."

Hurley, whose favorite event is the 100 butterfly — in which he took home a victory against Judge — credits his improvement to the entire Wood coaching staff.

"The coaches help me out a lot," Hurley said.

Recently, the senior has been competing in the grueling 200 individual medley, which combines backstroke, butterfly, breaststroke and freestyle.

"That's really tough," Hurley said. "I'm still working on that one."

Other individual Wood victories last Wednesday night were achieved by Joyce, in the 500 freestyle and David Keller in the 100 backstroke.

Keller, Whelan, Hurley and Brendon McGhee won the 200 medley relay while John Wright, Ron McIntire, Timothy Miller and Keller captured the 200 freestyle relay in the victory over Judge.

Steady improvement got the job done for Wood.
