## PCL seeks to join PIAA

Monumental.

That is really the only word to describe the announcement that will change Philadelphia High School sports as we know it.

On Monday, at the School District of Philadelphia building located right in the heart of North Broad Street, officials from the Philadelphia Catholic League (PCL), Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic Association, (PIAA), and state representative Gene DiGirolamo gathered to announce a decision people have been awaiting for some time now.

The PCL effective July 1, 2008, will officially join District 12, becoming a member of the PIAA. The decision was made by a joint committee consisting of Rev. Joseph McFadden (Auxiliary Bishop of the PCL), Bradley Cashman (PIAA executive director), Paul Vallas (School District of Philadelphia CEO), and Martin Bednarek (Commissioner of the School Reform Commission).

The move will allow Catholic League teams to compete in state run tournaments, whereas, before in the past, seasons would end after a league championship game.

Marjorie Weustner, executive director of the Office of Health, Safety, Physical Education and Sports Administration at the School District of Philadelphia, coordinated the press conference.

McFadden, Cashman, DiGirolamo, and Bednarek all spoke with enthusiasm over the groundbreaking news.

"The Philadelphia Catholic League has an 86 year tradition of excellence on and off the field of play," McFadden said. "We believe that this partnership advances those years of tradition and will positively affect the students of the Philadelphia region. This is a historic partnership."

Bednarek spoke of unity.

"Now we have the city coming together," he said, "I think District 12 will now be one of the toughest districts in the state. Wouldn't it be great to say 'not

only are we the Philadelphia champion, but the state champion as well."

DiGirolamo, a 1968 graduate of Bishop Egan (now Conwell-Egan Catholic) called the decision a "win-win situation for everyone involved," and turned to a group of students in attendance saying, "You will be making history."

District 12 is comprised of 58

schools, 45 public high schools and 13 charter schools. The addition of the PCL will bring the total to 75, with St. Joseph's Prep and La Salle's futures still up in the air. The idea has been floated around that those schools may join the Inter-Ac League, but no decision as of right now has been made. The two schools could also compete as independents,

The members of the committee all acknowledge this will be a work in progress over the next couple of years, but feel in the grand scheme of things, the decision will not only benefit the individuals and schools, but the city as well.

Hallahan (girls only), St. Hubert (girls only).

La Salle and St. Joe's Prep will not go in with the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, and will have to apply separately. La Salle expects to make a decision before the week is out, as to which route they will take.
