5 athletes to watch

(in alphabetical order):

Alison Barahona, Pennsbury: Barahona was the Suburban One League National Conference champion in both the 200 individual medley and 100 breaststroke. She was also a District One Class AAA qualifier in both events, finishing 10th in the breaststroke and 14th in the IM.

Katharine Buliga, Archbishop Wood: Buliga cut a dash as a freshman last year, qualifying for the PIAA Class AA meet in both the 200 and 500 freestyles. She was the Distict 12 Class AA champion in both events and finished fourth in the 200 and eighth in the 100 freestyle at the Philadelphia Catholic League championships.

Tommie Dillione, Council Rock North: Dillione, a senior, was the Courier Times Girls Swimmer of the Year last year for the second year in a row. She was the District One Class AAA champion in the 200 and 500 freestyles. At the PIAA championships, she was second in the 500 and third in the 200.

Alexa Fabbri, Villa Joseph Marie: Fabbri was the District One Class AA champion in both the 100 butterfly and 100 freestyle last year. She was second at the PIAA Class AA meet in both events, and the junior hopes to do as well this year.

Faye Melekos, Council Rock South: Melekos, a junior, is the returning Suburban One League National Conference champion in the 100 butterfly. She was a District One Class AAA qualifier in the 100 butterfly and 100 backstroke last year.

5 teams to watch

(in order of predicted strength):

Council Rock North: The Indians have won the Suburban One League National Conference title the last six years running and look to be the team to beat again this year. The Indians had a large turnout, which will help score points as they seek to make some noise at the district and state level.

Pennsbury: The Falcons have a lot of good swimmers and divers this year and should be competitive in the hunt for the SOL National Conference crown.

Council Rock South: The Golden Hawks have their third coach in as many seasons, but that shouldn't slow them down. They have a nice nucleus of returning swimmers and should be competitive in the SOL National Conference.

Archbishop Wood: The Vikings are always competitive in the Philadelphia Catholic League and District 12 Class AA, and this year should be no different. A good core of returning swimmers will see them through.

William Tennent: The team is smaller this year, but it still has some talent. How much that talent will be able to help the Panthers overcome the lower numbers will determine the team's level of success.

5 meets to watch

Council Rock North at Pennsbury, Jan. 14, 3:30 p.m.: This meet features the 2012-13 Suburban One League National Conference champion Indians against the runner-up Falcons. CR North has won the last six meetings between the two, with Pennsbury's last win over the Indians coming in the 2006-07 season.

State meet caps year for Doyle



This year's PIAA Class AAA meet is a bonus for Connor Doyle. The Pennsbury freshman

finished ninth at the District One Class AAA meet in the 100-yard backstroke, just missing the podium.

But his time of 53.09 was good enough to make him a time qualifier for the PIAA meet, slated to begin Wednesday at Bucknell.

"I'm very excited and looking forward to it," said Doyle, who is seeded 29th. "I just barely got in and I'm hoping to swim faster at states and move up to a higher place.

He began his swimming career at age 5.

"I've been to big meets before but I'm looking forward to seeing a high-level meet from the high school perspective," he said. "I know the competition is going to be tough and I'll shoot for the consolation heat but if I don't make it I won't have any regrets.

"This is definitely a great way to end my first season of high school swimming. I went as far as you can go.

Because he was a time qualifier and not an automatic qualifier, Doyle left the district meet unsure if he would make it to states.

"That just adds more excitement to being able to swim there," he said. "I appreciate it more because I wasn't sure I was going to get this opportunity.

He was with his team when he got the news.

"We were working a masters swim meet at the pool and my coach (Greg Stoloski) was checking the website every 20 minutes to see if I got in," Doyle said. "When I found out, the whole team was really supportive."

Even if he doesn't swim as well as he would like, Doyle will consider the meet a success.

"It's about the journey," he said. "If it doesn't work out for me and I don't swim my best there, I can still say that I made it to states as a freshman and hopefully it will motivate me to work harder and get back there next year and do better. As long as I do my best, I'll be happy with myself no matter where I finish.

Record setters

Several school records were broken at the District One meet.

Steven Keashon of Neshaminy lowered his own mark in the 200-yard freestyle with his 11th-place time of 1:44.45. His previous best was 1:46.16 at last year's district meet.

Keashon also set a school record in the 500 freestyle of 4:38.16, eclipsing the 4:40.41 by Dan Buschmann in 2002.

Neshaminy's 200 medley relay of Keashon, Bobby Winthur, Rob Giannini and David Kniess took down one of the oldest records in the program's books with their 17th-place time of 1:40.57.

The previous mark of 1:40.75 was set back in 1977 by Pete Shaffer, Steve Shaffer, Joe Wingert and Andy McCole.

The Council Rock North boys 200 medley relay of Jake Goroshko, Jack Donnelly, Brandon McCredie and Rvan Mitchell lowered their own school record with their sixth-place time of 1:37.38. They swam a 1:37.48 at the Suburban One League National Conference championships in February.

William Tennent's 200 freestyle relay of Brennen Bastian, Tom Del Conte, Matt Patrick and Ian Forlini posted a 1:27.36, topping the 1:27.89 by Andrew Richey, Bastian, Dylan Cooper and Connor Forlini at 2012's district competition.

BOYS SWIMMING: La Salle splashes past Archbishop Wood

Despite bringing back only three seniors from last year's state championship-winning team, La Salle entered the week still undefeated in Philadelphia Catholic League meets.

After Monday, the Explorers still are without a loss in league play following a 96-83 La Salle win over PCL counterpart and host Archbishop Wood in an evening meet at Eugene Klinger Middle School in Southampton.

The Explorers, who are now 7-1 overall and 5-0 in league meets, started out by winning the 200-yard medley relay and never relinquished their lead, despite the Vikings keeping the score close throughout the evening.

"I brought most of my younger kids today and Thomas Conroy had a really nice day with the 100 backstroke and while anchoring a relay,' La Salle coach Fran Lichtner said. "The idea (tonight) was to get these younger kids some experience and get them a chance to shine a little bit and they all did a really nice job. I'm very pleased. We worked very hard, but we're also almost at the time of the season where we're going to be getting ready for the big meet.'

Conroy led off the 200 medley relay to start the meet, swimming a 27.44 to help the Explorers win the race by more than eight full seconds. Liiam Duffy, Gabe Labella and Evan Wilt were part of the relay team which finished with a time of 1:49.09 to help the Explorers to an early eight points.

After Gus Lawn helped the Vikings (3-3, 3-3) to a win in the next event, the 200 freestyle, the Explorers ripped off a pair of consecutive wins, with Duffy leading the 200 individual medley with a time of 2:10.19, which was followed by a 23.66 second showing by Harrison Schultz in the 50 freestyle.

Wood won the next event, with James Brazukas scoring a 133.30 to easily capture first place in the one-meter diving portion of the meet, but La Salle came right back, as Thomas Rogers swam a 57.32 to win the 100 butterfly.

Wood's Timothy Quigley, who finished second in the 100 butterfly, went on to win the 100 breaststroke with a time of 1:05.69. Quigley then led the 400 freestyle relay team which also finished in first, beating out La Salle's team — one which was anchored by Conroy — by 1.25 seconds. Wood's time of 3:39.18 gave the Vikings eight points and a very respectable finish in the tough league meet.

"My kids really swam well,' Wood coach Charlie Stillwell said. "They knew it was going to be a good meet and La Salle brought enough kids for it to be competitive and my boys wanted to make it competitive and they did. They swam well, they represented themselves well and they've been getting a lot better over the years. This is our best year by far and we're going to have a winning record at the end of the year. We have a really good shot to win District 12 and send a few kids to states with 1-2 in relays and lot of individuals. We're really looking forward to it.'

The Vikings got a solid showing from Lawn, who finished in second place in the 100 freestyle to go along with his win in the 200. Lawn also started off Wood's 200 freestyle relay team which finished in second

Stillwell, who will have his Vikings take on Bonner-Prendergast this Wednesday, is very impressed with his team, especially his younger swimmers.

"I have a very good freshman class with six new guys,' he said. "They've infused a lot of the older kids, so I have a really good mix of young and old and it has really helped the team a lot.'

When asked if he believes his team has what it takes to return to the state championship, Lichtner said he believes his team is one of the few in the hunt for a title.

"I ended my high school career with a state gold medal, and I can't think of a better sendoff that that."

She will continue her career next year at Penn State, where she is undecided on a major.

'I'm really looking forward to Penn State," she said. "I think I'll have room to grow there, and I'm excited to have the opportunity to better myself academically and in the pool.'

CR North coach Ted Schueller appreciated Dillione's effort.

'She is the hardest working and most focused swimmer I have ever coached," he said. "She is a team leader and a great example to the other

"She is also a very versatile swimmer. She can do so many different events, and that was a real asset to the team.

So when opportunities come her way, Alexa Fabbri should be in pretty good shape. She 's shown she can deal with the setbacks.

The Villa Joseph Marie junior finished third in the 100-yard freestyle with her time of 50.63 seconds in Saturday's conclusion of the PIAA Class AA swimming and diving championships at Bucknell University's Kinney Natatorium.

The bronze medal took the sting out of Friday's mishap in the 100 butterfly.

Seeded second coming into the meet to Rebecca Luft of Northern York, Fabbri posted a preliminary time of 55.98 that placed her second to Luft for the butterfly final.

In the final, Fabbri appeared to have taken second place for her second consecutive silver medal in that event, but was disqualified for a false start.

"Stuff happens like that," she said. "I think it's more how you react to it that counts. My coach (Raymond Keown) said that when these things happen, you bounce back from them, so that's what I did.

"It stuck with me for a good portion of the night, but as soon as I woke up in the morning, I knew it had to be over and done with for me. It was a new day and a new race."

She started the day as the second seed in the 100 freestyle and swam a 51.20 in the preliminaries to hold that spot before getting third in the final, her second bronze in this event in as many years.

"I'm happy with how I swam. I went into it just wanting a best time, and I did it by a tenth (of a second), so I'll take it," she said. "I wasn't really worried about placement. It's a sport of beating the clock. If I could get second or first, that would be great, but you're really racing yourself.

"This helps me get over what happened in the butterfly a lot. Now I can say that I ended the season on a positive note."

Also for the Jems, Emily Messina was 19th in the 100 freestyle (54.69).

Archbishop Wood's Katharine Buliga finished 19th in the 500 freestyle (5:19.28), and Claire Cochrane, Caitlin Bedesem, Buliga and Hannah Cochrane teamed up to take 22nd in the 400 freestyle relay (3:50.80).

Dominique DiRienzo was 22nd in diving (138.25).

Gus Lawn of Archbishop Wood finished 32nd in the boys 500 freestyle (5:29.95).
